## Agency Invites Public Comment on State Accreditation Efforts

A team of assessors from the Police Officers Standards and Training Council arrived on February 22, 2012, to examine the Meriden Police Department's policy and procedures as they relate to **Tier One I Liability**, II Professional, III General Management of the state accreditation standards.

Verification by the team that the Meriden Police Department meets the POST Councils state of the art accreditation standards is part of a voluntary process to gain accreditation—a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence.

As part of the on-site assessment, agency employees and members of the community are invited to offer comments. Comments can be mailed to Harold T. The accreditation manager for the Meriden Police Department is A/Captain. Salvatore J. Nesci The assessment team is composed of law enforcement practitioners from the Connecticut law enforcement community. The assessors have reviewed written materials; interviewed individuals; and visited offices and other places where compliance can be witnessed.

Once the POST Council accreditation assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the POST Council Accreditation committee who will recommend to the POST Council if the agency is to be accredited or re-accredited.

Accreditation is for three years, during which time the agency must submit annual reports attesting continued compliance with those standards under which they were initially accredited or re-accredited.
